The draft of the syllabus developed based on the feedback collected from the stakeholders was reviewed. The members noted all the components stated in the agenda and made the following recommendations as per the suggestions in the feedback by Alumna, Students and Faculty members





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1. It was resolved to change slightly the title of the semester – V Paper –V Hist5-1 “Colonial and Nationalist India (A.D. 1856-1905)” and renamed it as “ Colonialism and Nationalism in India (1856- 1905)” since the chapter in section C is focusing on the emergence of Nationalism.
2. It was unanimously resolved to remove the chapter 3 in section A ‘ Industrial Revolution and chapter 6 in section C ‘Russian Revolution’ from Paper VI semester V Hist5-2 “History of Modern Europe (1789-1990)” due to the big syllabus consisting of 10 chapters and not much relevant to the present situation
3. To list out the topics related Gender equity, Human values, environment, Professional ethics; highlighting the local and national and Global issues in the course; and skill component employability and entrepreneurship components in the syllabus
4. The Board approved the syllabus with the modifications suggested
