The departmental proposal to offer 9 Hard Core Papers, 10 Soft Core Papers, 2 Open Electives and 1 Research Project during two year M A programme was placed before the Board for consideration.

The Evaluation Scheme in the ratio of 70:30 marks (Semester end exams and Continuous Internal Assessment) was presented and approved.

#### Semester-End Question paper pattern:

- 4 questions to be answered out of 8 in Section A and 1 short note out of 3 in Section B for all papers except for Papers Introduction to English Language and Linguistics, Functional English and Research Project.
- Two questions carrying fifteen marks each out of four, five questions carrying two marks each out of seven, fifteen marks for transcription (From English to IPA and vice versa), five marks for combining sentences, five marks for immediate constituent analysis, five marks for applying T-rules for the paper Introduction to English Language and Linguistics
- Paragraph writing based on the given outlines / summarizing a given passage 10 marks; Objective type questions on correctness of the language - 20 marks; Letter writing / CV writing / minutes writing - 10 marks; essay / precise - 10 marks; Report / speech / dialogue writing - 10 marks; transcription from IPA to English and vice versa - 10 marks for Functional English.
- Dissertation Evaluation, both external and internal Total 70 marks: 40 Dissertation Evaluation; 30 Viva-voce

#### Continuous Internal Assessment scheme:

Assignment – 10 marks; Internal Test – 10 marks; Seminar – 10 marks for all the papers except for the papers ELT, Individual Development and Communication Skills and Writing for the Media wherein, 20 mark is for the practicum and 10 marks for Internal Test.
